### **Division 4 Updates**

#### **Division 4 Council Meeting**

#### **Midwinter Conference Highlights**

Division 4 had a great turnout at the midwinter conference in Longmont. Including the Monument Hill club we had 16 members attend. Most clubs' incoming officers were able to attend club leadership training, which is mandatory. Any incoming officers still needing training need to contact Lt. Gov. Elect John Schaefer or myself.

Many Pikes Peak Division members were able to help package meals for Kids Against Hunger. The 20,000+ meals were all sent to help the relief effort in Haiti. The energy and excitement could really be felt in the room.

The Interclub luncheon program was provided by 2 cyber-cops who pose as children on the internet. The police officers informed us how sexual predators use internet chat rooms, instant messaging, and even cell phones to lure children. The program was difficult to listen to at times but the officers really gave us some necessary information to protect our children and grandchildren against predators.

#### **Kids Against Hunger**

After helping at the packaging event in Longmont, the Kiwanians & Key Clubbers that attended midwinter really are enthusiastic about bringing a KAH event to the Colorado

Springs area. South Denver Kiwanis KAH director Kenward Bradley (Cell 303-478-9888) is more than willing to help us make it happen. He is willing to come to any of the Colorado Springs clubs and be the program. To package 10,000 meals we need: A location, volunteers and \$2,500. Additionally we will need transportation to bring the raw materials (rice, soy, veggie mix and vitamins) and tools (scales, bag sealers, boxes, etc.) from Denver and the finished product back to Denver. We may want to have the initial event as a division event. But a single club or multiple clubs may want to work together on a KAH event. For instance, Manitou Springs and their Key Club want to have one in the fall.
